There is much to be thankful for at St. Francis Prep! As we complete our Thanksgiving Drive for the needy, our Campus Ministry Department rolled out our school wide campaign "Gratitude is an Attitude" in which every student received a wrist band as a reminder to always give.

The agencies we are serving:

St. Francis Table (soup kitchen and pantry) at St. Matthias Church, Queen of Peace Residence, Hour Children (works with children of incarcerated adults), Women Helping Women (works with victims of domestic violence), St. Aloysius Food Pantry, Incarnation Food Pantry, St. John's Bread and Life.

Our students completed the first quarter of their 2013-14 academic journey on November 8th. Students should continue to work hard, connect with their teachers for extra help and seek out their guidance counselor to discuss personal or academic concerns.

Parents need to remain connected to the academic progress of their child by checking Power School on a regular basis. Our Homework Assistance Program is available to all students in the Library every day, every period, as well as before and after school. Peer Counselors and members of the National Honor Society are available to tutor any student.

November Highlights:

- On a recent field trip to the DNA Learning Center in Lake Success, a select group of Mrs. Ashkenazy's Biotechnology students had the unique opportunity to analyze a sample of their own DNA with state-of-the-art DNA microchip analyzers. The DNA Center is one of only two teaching labs in the US containing this equipment. While exploring the center, students also toured the NS-LIJ Clinical Core Lab. This is one of two world-class robotic labs that contain robotic arms and conveyor belts from start to finish. Blood samples and hematology from the surrounding local area hospitals are processed robotically, completely untouched by hand.
- The Freshman girls Cross Country Team won the Brooklyn-Queens Championship led by Amanda Hardardt 2nd Place, Alyssa Olivieri 3rd, Nora Flores 5th, Rosalie Robinson 8th, Dora Lombardozzi 10th, Kathryn Pender 16th and Amaya Okogeri 21st Place. They also placed 3rd in the 9th City Championship. The next week Alyssa and Amanda led the JV team to a third place finish in the JV City Championship followed by Sophomore Nora Bauso.



• The Girls Varsity Volleyball Team is both City and State Champs! Girls Varsity Volleyball went 14-0 during the season. They won the Brooklyn/Queens championship for the 7th year in a row. 15 of the 16 players have over a 90% GPA. Congratulations to **Coach Colucci**, his staff and outstanding players.
